502 KAR 13:010, Application for certification under Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act of 2004 (“LEOSA”), 18 U.S.C. 926C, for honorably retired elected or appointed peace officers, has been filed with the Legislative Research Commission for amendment. This administrative regulation establishes the requirements and procedures for certification. This amendment updates the regulation to reflect current practices and procedures for application for a licensed to carry a concealed deadly weapon under LEOSA. An electronic application process is provided. A reference related to operator’s license or identification card issued by circuit court clerks is revised to the Transportation Cabinet. The title and format of the KSP-123 “Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act Peace Officer Range Qualification Certification” form is updated. The KSP-124B “LEOSA Law Enforcement Retirement Certification” form is updated to allow for years, months, and dates of service to be documented. The “CCDW LEOSA Application Mailing Schedule for Sheriffs” is eliminated. The agency website is added as a source for materials incorporated by reference.

This amendment updates the title and format of the KSP-123 “Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act Peace Officer Range Qualification Certification” form. 502 KAR 13:040, Issuance, expiration, and renewal of certification to carry a concealed deadly weapon pursuant to the Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act of 2004 (“LEOSA”), 18 U.S.C. 926C, for honorably retired elected or appointed peace officers, has been filed with the Legislative Research Commission for amendment. This administrative regulation establishes the requirements and procedures for the issuance, expiration, and renewal of a LEOSA license. This amendment updates the regulation to reflect current practices and procedures for issuance, expiration, and renewal of a LEOSA license. An electronic notification process is provided for issuance, expiration and renewal of LEOSA licenses. A reference related to operator’s license or identification card issued by circuit court clerks is revised to the Transportation Cabinet. The prior notice of expiration is reduced to ninety days from one-hundred-twenty days. This amendment updates the title and format of the KSP-123 “Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act Peace Officer Range Qualification Certification” form. The KSP-124B “LEOSA Law Enforcement Retirement Certification” form is updated to allow for years, months, and dates of service to be documented. This administrative regulation establishes the requirements and procedures for the replacement of LEOSA licenses that have been lost, destroyed, or stolen. This amendment makes technical corrections in the format of the regulation. The KSP-127 “Request for Duplicate LEOSA License” form is updated for format only. 502 KAR 13:060, Change of personal information regarding certification to carry a concealed deadly weapon pursuant to the Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act of 2004 (“LEOSA”), 18 U.S.C. 926C, for honorably retired elected or appointed peace officers, has been filed with the Legislative Research Commission for amendment. This administrative regulation establishes the requirements and procedures for the change of personal information regarding LEOSA licensees. This amendment deletes a definition that appears in 502 KAR 13:010. The KSP-120 “Law Enforcement Officers Safety Act Licensee Request for Change of Personal Information” form is updated for format and to add an instruction to print legibly and circle any changes. This administrative regulation establishes the reasons an application form shall be deemed incomplete and the required procedures for the department. This amendment deletes a definition that appears in 502 KAR 13:010. An electronic notification process is provided for incomplete applications for LEOSA licenses. The “Missing Information/Document” form is eliminated.
