502 KAR 20:020, Detection of deception examiners, has been filed with the Legislative Research Commission for amendment. This administrative regulation establishes the practice requirements for detection of deception examiners. This administrative regulation is revised to update the reference to the United States Code that prohibits law enforcement officers, prosecuting officers and government officials from requiring a victim of an alleged sexual offense to submit to polygraph testing as a condition for proceeding with the investigation of the offense. The regulation also includes a grammatical or syntax revision.
